Objective 3.1: Increase communication and partnership between school and law enforcement for consistent enforcement of policies & laws.

Strategy 3.1.1: ATOD School Policy review and development

Intervening Variable: lack of continuity in school policy/law enforcement

Local Condition: Lack of communication between school and law enforcement has created inconsistent policy and law enforcement message for students

Objective 3.2: Increase community and youth disapproval of alcohol use by youth ages 12-20

Strategy 3.2.1: Environmental – Social Norms - Washington Drug Free Youth

Strategy 3.2.2: Provide public awareness and environmental information at SAMHSA Town Hall at least every two years on reducing youth access to alcohol.

Intervening Variable: Community norm favorable to use support social access of alcohol

Local Condition: The community-at-large reports low tolerance of youth use but youth don't feel the community thinks it is wrong

Objective 3.3: Increase community member support of coalition role, purpose, and mission between Jan 1, 2014 – September 29, 2014 as measured in annual community surveys

Strategy 3.3.1: Provide public awareness information and education about coalition initiatives.
